**MISDEMEANOR AND PETTY OFFENSES
FOREITURE OF COLLATERAL SCHEDULE**

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Pursuant to the requirements of Subdivision (d) of Rule 58 of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure, the attached Forfeiture of Collateral Schedule has been ordered by the Chief Judge of the United States District Court for the Southern District of California.
2. This schedule shall supersede all prior schedules for all Magistrate Courts and shall become effective April 1, 1998.
3. Payment of a fixed sum may be accepted in suitable causes in lieu of appearance and as authorizing the termination of the proceedings.
4. If a defendant fails to pay a fixed sum, request a hearing, or appear in response to a citation or violation notice, the clerk or a magistrate judge may issue a notice for the defendant to appear before the court on a certain date. The notice may afford the defendant an additional opportunity to pay a fixed sum in lieu of appearance, and shall be served upon the defendant by mailing a copy to the defendant's last known address.
5. Where the column "MA" is checked after the bail amount, a court appearance by the defendant is mandatory, and s/he must be directed by the person accepting the bail to appear in the appropriate court at a particular time and date specified by the United States Magistrate of the Southern District of California.
6. Petty offenses are listed with the letter "P" preceding section number. The term "petty offense for which no sentence will be imposed," means any petty offense as defined in 18 U.S.C. § 19. Misdemeanor violations are listed with the letter "M".
7. Proof of correction/compliance violations are designated by "PC".
8. Where the bail amount column is marked "TBD", the bail amount will be determined in court.
