Ratified in 1868, the Fourteenth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution provides, in part, that no state can “deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws.”

Over the past 150 years, Congress and the courts have applied this “Equal Protection Clause” to our right to equal education.
