General Order No. 689-A

General Order 689 is amended as follows:

The Court continues to believe that all of its employees are essential in carrying out its functions. However, the Court has received guidance and directions from the Administrative Office of the Courts as to the requirements of the Anti-Deficiency Act. Under the Act, only those employees performing excepted functions may be required to work.

The Clerk of the Court, the Chief of Probation and the Chief of Pretrial Services have prepared a Phase 2 Shut Down Plan which is hereby adopted. Under the Plan, only those employees performing excepted functions may continue to work. Those functions include the filing and adjudication of cases and enforcement of judgments; supervision of pretrial and sentenced defendants and all essential case supporting services from and for District Judges, Magistrate Judges, clerks, probation officers and pretrial officers. Employees not performing excepted functions must be furloughed under the Anti-Deficiency Act. The Phase 2 Plan is subject to revision upon further guidance from the Administrative Office of the Courts.
